Registration Desk Hours and Location

The conference will take place from 2-3 March. St John's University Manhattan Campus is one building at the above address. The conference registration desk will be located on the first floor in the lobby of the building/campus. Delegates will be presented with a name badge and must keep their name badge on them at all times throughout the conference. Registration will begin at 8:00 am on the first day of the conference, 2 March and will be open throughout all hours of the conference.

Any questions that arise at the conference should be directed to the staff at the conference registration desk. This includes questions regarding presentation equipment, your particular presentation, signing up for tours, and questions about submitting your article to the journal.

Session Types

- Themed Paper Presentation: If you have a Paper Presentation in a Themed Session (formally referred to as a 30-minute session), you have been scheduled into a 75 or 100-minute session with three or four other presenters. In these themed sessions, papers are grouped by similar topics or by different perspectives on a particular issue. This format allows for greater participation and enhanced discussion. In themed sessions, each presenter speaks for twenty minutes. A group discussion of all presented papers follows in the time remaining. To allow adequate time for group discussion prepared remarks are limited to twenty minutes.
- Workshop Presentation: If you are scheduled to present a Workshop, you have been slated in a 45-minute session in which skills or concepts are taught, demonstrated, or explored within an interactive platform. These presentations often include worksheets, props, or activities to further articulate the presented research and add an element of active involvement for the session attendees. This less-structured format is led by the researching author(s) and allows for questions and discussions to take place throughout the duration of the session.
- Colloquia: This presentation type involves a group of 5 colleagues that present separate papers on a common topic or theme. Ninety minutes are allotted for this session type and the researching authors divide the presentation up as appropriate to their chosen format. Time for questions and discussions can take place throughout the duration of the session.
- Poster Session: Individual scholars present visual displays (posters) of the status of their work, or exhibits of artwork, models, or other products. Authors will have the opportunity to hold discussions with the delegates who are circulating amongst the poster boards in this 45-minute session. The poster session will take place during the Welcome Reception, participants are welcome to setup their posters during the break before the last session of the day. (Projectors and computers are not provided by the conference for this session type.)
- Focused Discussion Session: Authors are each assigned a numbered table in a large meeting room for the full 45-minute session, during which time they converse and interact with interested delegates who join them at their table. The discussion may begin with the author presenting a synopsis of their work, to generate discussion on the topic. Authors are encouraged to bring copies of their papers and/or a short handout summarizing their work for distribution at their tables. Multiple authors of a single paper may participate, and one article per roundtable may be submitted for publication. (Projectors and computers are not provided by the conference for this session type.)

Presentation Equipment

All session rooms at St John's University Manhattan Campus will be fully equipped with computers, screens, and data projectors. **Delegates will only need to bring their presentations pre-loaded on a USB thumb drive.** We suggest always having a backup copy of your presentation that is easily accessible from the web.

Directions and Transportation in Toronto

Airport Arrivals and Getting to the Conference Hotel

There are two international airports in New York City, LaGuardia International Airport (LGA) and John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK). Please find information below on arriving into both airports.

John F. Kennedy International Airport

John F. Kennedy International Airport (IATA: JFK, ICAO: KJFK) referred to as JFK is an international airport located in Jamaica, Queens, in the south-eastern portion of New York City. It is about 12 miles southeast of Lower Manhattan.

JFK AirTrain

The conference recommended mode of travel from JFK airport is the AirTrain. There are two AirTrain lines that can be used to reach the conference hotel, The Standard, East Village. AirTrain Red and AirTrain Green. This trip is about 90 minutes and costs US\$7.75. More information on the AirTrain can be found on the JFK website here:

Taxis

Taxis can be taken from JFK into Manhattan and will easily reach The Standard, East Village. Please note this trip is approximately US\$80-100 and tipping is customary at 15-20%. LaGuardia International Airport

MTA Bus

New York City Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) buses provide service between LaGuardia Airport, Manhattan, Queens and beyond with connection to the subway, Long Island Rail Road and Metro-North Railroad.

A one-way trip on MTA buses or subways costs \$2.75. MetroCards can be purchased at MetroCard vending machines located throughout LaGuardia Airport terminals. Passengers using MetroCards get a free transfer from their bus to the subway.

Taxi

Metered taxi service is available at all LaGuardia Airport terminal buildings simply follow the taxi signs after baggage claim. A trip to the conference hotel, The Standard East Village, is about US\$50-60. Tipping is customary between 15-20%. For more information please see:
